FINAL REPORT DISEMINATION OF CSOSI 2020

I. Seminar/Conference

The 2020 Civil Society Organization Sustainability Index for Indonesia Launching Seminar was held on October 14, 2021, coinciding with the 4th Indonesian NGO Council Congress. Journey of Indonesia NGO Council promotes the importance of NGO accountability has been running for 10 years or a decade. The NGO Council together with 121 member NGOs as well as other CSOs, both at the national and grassroots levels continue to be dynamic in the democratic space of nation building. This can be seen in the last five years from the results of the CSOSI in 2015 to 2020 continue to experience ups and down.

Based on the CSOSI table above, the legal environment tends to decrease, this shows that the democracy index and still high human rights violations make the civil society movement not conducive. This situation is then exacerbated by the financial ability of CSOs which tends to decrease.

The picture of CSOs condition in Indonesia is also captured from membership of Indonesia NGO Council which continue to face classic problems, such as related to the activeness of members, the generality of vision and mission, organizational sustainability, the strictness of code of ethics, etc. So that the number of the Indonesia NGO Council members also experienced ups and downs, although there were additional organizations but there were also inactive, resigned, and even some who had disbanded. One of the main problem is financial resilience. This situation is not only experienced by members of the NGO Council but also by many other NGOs in Indonesia. Based on the results of the INFID study (2021), it illustrates that the level of dependence of CSO on international donors is high, while support from international donors is reduced due to Indonesia's status as a middle-income country, this has an impact on the declining financial capabilities of CSO.

Responding to the many challenges faced by CSOs in Indonesia, whose conditions are increasingly falling in the midst of the covid-19 pandemic has prompted the Indonesian NGO Council to reflect and consolidate between NGOs, especially at the level of members of the NGO Council itself. So that the launching of the results of the 2020 CSOSI became the opening activity at the fourth Indonesian NGO Council Congress. The Indonesia NGO Council Congress is an important momentum to reorganize the sustainability of NGOs after the covid-19 pandemic. As a trigger for the discussion, the NGO Council invited three speakers, namely:

1. **Laode Muhammad Syarif, S.H., LL.M., Ph.D** (Commissioner of the Corruption Eradication Commission - KPK), presenting material about “Urgency of Transparency and Accountability for Civil Society Organizations”
2. **Wariki** (Director of Politics and Communication, BAPPENAS), presenting material about “Funding Support Opportunities from APBN /APBD for CSO”

3. **Lusi Herlina** (Writers team of the CSOSI-2020), presenting material about “**Result of the 2020 CSOSI**”

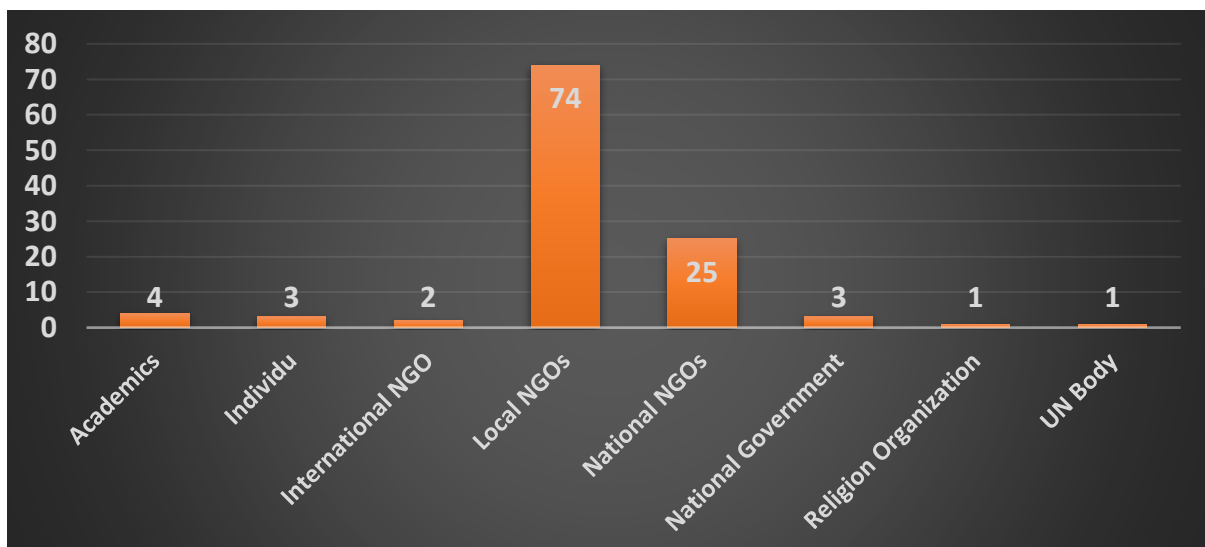

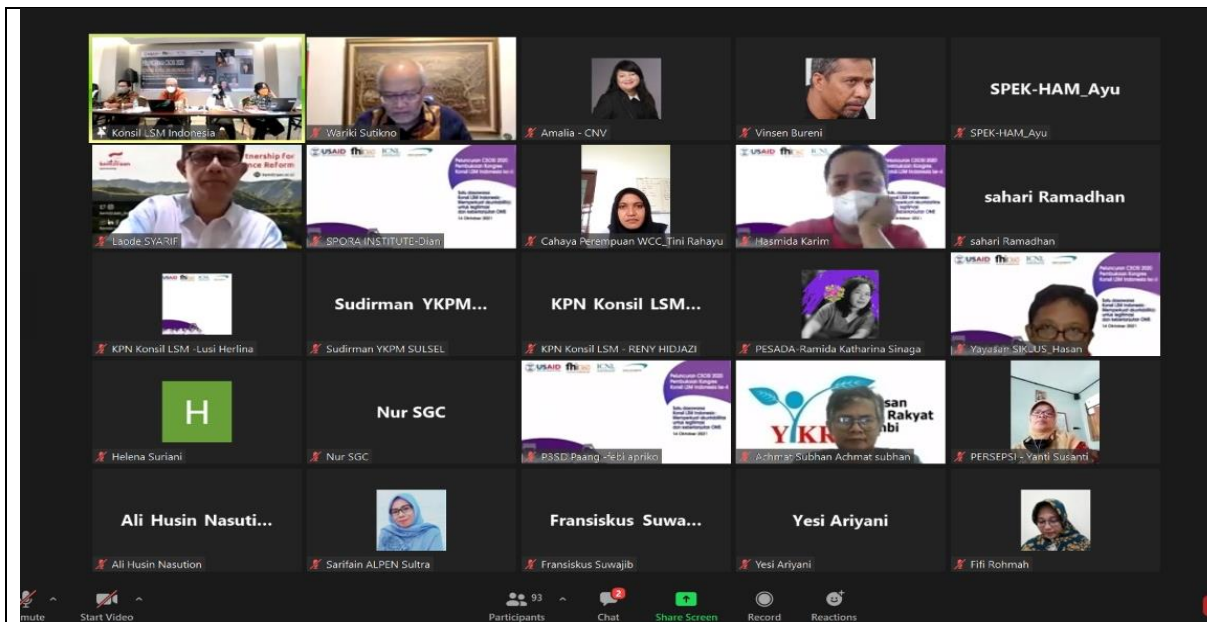

II. Participant

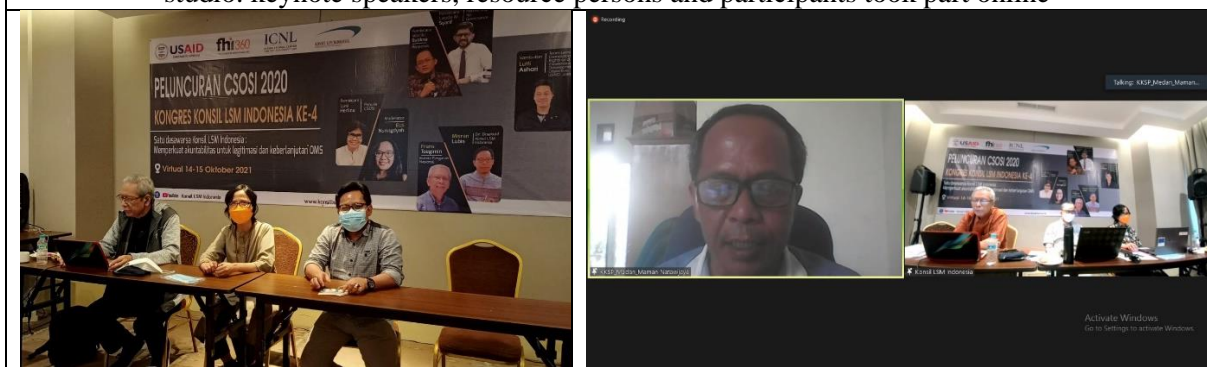
Launching CSOSI 2020 was followed by 132 participants, this number has exceeded the targeted in the invitation which is as many as 120 participants. Participants came from 113 organizations, with representative INGOs, National NGO, Local NGO, Academics, Business Sector, Government, and Individuals. 74 organizations from 113 organizations present are CSO members of the NGO Council who will attend the 4th Indonesian NGO Council congress.

III. Output of Seminar

The results achieved from this activity are:

1. The CSOSI 2020 was directly socialized to at least 113 organizations at the time of the hybrid seminar. Facebook publications were accessed by 2,631 visitors and via Statcount web: konsillsm.or.id by 4,206 visitors.
2. There was a fairly good interaction in discussions with sources, there were at least 12 questioners in the CSOSI 2020 launching seminar, and generally discussed the sustainability of the CSO and the encouragement to the government to allocate the budget for the CSOs.
3. The Material urgency of Transparency and Accountability for Civil Society Organizations delivered by Laode Muhammad Syarif, is a deep reflection for all CSOs that the portrait of corruption in Indonesia shows that the quality of democracy is very poor. Laode reminded all CSOs present "hopefully the portrait of corruption in Indonesia is not a reflection of the quality of CSOs and it is time for CSOs to improve to become a good CSO in accordance with the quality management system."
4. The government through BAPPENAS (Indonesian Ministry of National Development Planning) has said that to improve the quality of democracy there needs to be support for

CSOs through government funding. If previously there has been a budget of 800M in RPJMN 2020-2024 but then lost because the academic script is considered less strong then now KSP (Executive Office of the President of the Republic of Indonesia) again proposes for a new policy in the form of presidential regulations. This policy draft is being prepared by the NGO Consortium in which there is the involvement of the Indonesian NGO Council.
